23 years ago, the most pressing and dramatic problem was the water: the construction of the aqueduct brought drinking water to approximately 20000 people, improving living conditions in Nyandiwa and neighboring villages. Consequently decreased the spread of infectious diseases.

The IKSDP (Italian Kenyan Scout Development Project) aqueduct is 20 km long with 5 tanks and 14 fountains.

Are now underway the works of maintenance and improvement.



The Kiwa island Dispensary, particularly isolated, has been fitted with solar panels. The Nyandiwa Dispensary provides daily medical help and are held periodic preventive campaigns and specialized interventions to spread the hygienic culture, knowledge of the most common and serious infections, as HIV and viral diseases.

Agriculture, livestock and fishing are very difficult in this area, with serious impact on the community. For this reason, we're trying new and small businesses, stimulating development of local cooperatives.



For example, the breeding of catfish and tilapia (a tropical species of Lake Victoria) started years ago to tackle the crisis caused by overfishing of multinational corporations. Continues the rearing of laying hens and dairy cows: activity deemed impractical due to climate of this region.

Today, this is able to improve family food availability, enhancing the work of young people and women.

Since 2009, was launched the 'Kitawa Environmental Project' (6 km from Nyandiwa), with an experimental cultivation of Jatropha; the plant grows in arid land fighting desertification. From seeds produces fuel oil, used for lamps, cookers and for production of biogas and biodiesel; from waste are derived soap, glycerine, candles and agricultural fertilizers.



The plantation grows on about 17 hectares of never-before cultivated, arid and stony land, with irrigation system and structures for seeds processing. Since 2011 the production of vegetables planted between the jatropha trees has been carried out with encouraging results.

On the coast, we're working on a Natural Park, which aims to appreciate the wide variety of flora and fauna: a great project for the next few years.
