

'IKSDP Harambee Gwassi-Kenya' is an International Project of Cooperation and Solidarity supported by NGO Brownsea Foundation. The project, called IKSDP (Italian Kenyan Scout Development Project), was started in 1983 with the aim of improving the welfare among the communities of this area; it promotes the social, cultural and economic growth of the Nyandiwa peninsula, on the shores of Lake Victoria, one of the poorest areas of Kenya.

"Harambee" in Swahili means "Working Together" and the cry is used generically when you make an effort together, for example when the fishermen pull nets ... represents the very spirit of the project: volunteers work with the population of Gwassi to promote global development, not welfare schemes but united by one common purpose, understanding and mutual respect.

The IKSDP Hostel is able to accommodate single, families and groups: all rooms are comfortable and sober, with meals served in a large hall.

The experimental cultivation of sunflowers began in 2014 in our Kitawa fields: after one series of small productions, in the summer 2017 the oil production went to full capacity. A real success, made possible by the squeezing system donated by the 'Calabria for Harambee'. Also this year we made 2 excellent crops in our Kitawa garden!

The IKSDP project has exploited all of renewable energy resources (solar and wind) and natural ones. In Kitawa, the 'Environment and Development' project is active, for the cultivation of Jatropha, from which seeds is obtained the fuel oil (for kitchen and lighting). From this oil, appropriately filtered, it is obtained Biodiesel fuel for Diesel modified engines. Soap, glycerine, lubricant and fertilizer are obtained from the scraps. 17 hectares of arid land, now irrigated, produce excellent fuel oil. A part of the land is a Didactic Park for students, given the wealth of local flora and fauna.
